Clark College's Dental Hygiene program receives M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust funding

\$250,000 grant to outfit program with new equipment

VANCOUVER, Wash.—M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust has provided a quarter of a million dollars to Clark College for new dental equipment for its nationally recognized Dental Hygiene program.

The \$250,000 grant from Vancouver-based M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust will provide modern equipment to ensure Clark students have access to current advances in the dental industry and that the program meets federal privacy regulations.

Clark College is currently in a \$20 million comprehensive fundraising campaign and the grant assists in fulfilling a goal for it signature Dental Hygiene program. The college has just over \$2 million left to raise to meet its private-sector support objective.

The Firstenburg Family Dental Hygiene Education & Care Center is currently undergoing renovations, adding more chairs to the teaching clinic, adding paperless charting software and updating the digital radiography area, as well as other enhancements. The M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust grant enables the college to purchase such items as instructional cameras, workstation computers, radiology computers, patient privacy materials and vacuum systems.
